Katrina Chang is an expert in international trade. She joined Kim & Chang in 2015 and serves as a senior advisor on the firm's International Trade & Customs Practice.

Prior to joining Kim & Chang, Ms. Chang was a career Federal Service Officer for US Customs and Border Protection (CBP), the largest law enforcement agency in the United States, serving for over 27 years in a variety of leadership positions. From these positions, she oversaw diverse trade enforcement issues, such as implementing and enforcing FTAs, antidumping/countervailing duties, intellectual property, and other industry-specific customs compliance issues (auto, steel, petroleum, electronics, etc.). She was also a member of the negotiating team for the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP) and FTA negotiations between the United States and the European Union, known as the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (T-TIP). Previously, Ms. Chang completed special assignments at the US Trade Representative and the US International Trade Commission, where she was involved in formulating US trade policy at the highest level.

Ms. Chang was the first Asian-American Director selected to lead CBP's Asia/Pacific region of International Affairs. In this role, she oversaw CBP's attaches and promoted critical international trade/immigration/security programs in that region. She is a graduate of the US Federal Government's Executive Potential Program, an inter-agency leadership program for federal executives, as well as of the CBP's multidisciplinary Command Leadership Program for its law enforcement executives.

She holds a Master's degree in Public Administration from the George Washington University and a Bachelor of Science degree in business and management from the University of Maryland.
