Mr. Chang entered on duty as a Special Agent with the FBI in March 2008. After graduating from the FBI Academy, he was assigned to the Los Angeles Field Office. From 2008 through 2013, Mr. Chang was assigned to the Transnational Organized Crime – East (TOC-E) Asian African Middle Eastern Organized Crime squad where he investigated Asian criminal enterprises. A significant achievement during his tenure as lead Case Agent was the disruption and dismantlement of a multi-state Korean criminal enterprise engaged in narcotics, check kiting and identity theft. Recognizing the need for law enforcement collaboration, Mr. Chang also established the FBI LA Korean Organized Crime Task Force (LA KOCTF) consisting of several of our local and federal law enforcement partners.

In 2013, Mr. Chang volunteered and transferred to a counterintelligence squad in the Los Angeles Field Office, Orange County Resident Agency. While assigned to the counterintelligence squad he investigated efforts by the People's Republic of China and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea to acquire dual use and US export restricted technology.

In March 2016, Mr. Chang promoted to Supervisory Special Agent at FBI Headquarters in the CID TOC-E Asian African Middle Eastern (AAMEOU) unit where he program managed complex Asian organized crime investigations for all western region field offices and the ALAT program.

In January 2018, Mr. Chang was selected as a Supervisory Special Agent in the New York Field Office Counterintelligence Division. As SSA, he established the global Malign Foreign Influence and Transnational Repression counterintelligence squad, was responsible for several highly sensitive Group I counterintelligence investigations and was the exclusive FBI liaison to both the United Nations (UN) and the United States Mission to the United Nations (USMUN).

In May 2022, Mr. Chang was selected to serve as the Assistant Section Chief for the CID Transnational Organized Crime (TOC-E) Global Section - Eastern Hemisphere. During his tenure, ASC Chang provided management and operational oversight for all FBI TOC-E domestic and international matters; to include management of the following three organized crime sections; Asian/African/Middle Eastern/Major Theft/Art Crime Operations Unit; Balkan/Eurasian/La Cosa Nostra Operations Unit; Hi-Tech Organized Crime Unit as well as supervision of nine CID ALATs across the globe.

Mr. Chang holds a Bachelor's Degree in International Relations and a Juris Doctor Degree. He also earned Le Certificate de Humane Rights from the Université de Strasbourg in Strasbourg, France.
